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I. MISSION STATEMENT

To improve the success of students whose first Language is not English by building skills in academic communication so that they may Achieve their academic goals in the Universidad de las Americas community and in the English-speaking world at large.

II. PURPOSE

The Purpose of this evaluation is to guarantee tat these courses fulfill the Bilingual Mission of the University.

- To verify that all classes are delivered in English with due respect to all skills
- To provide professors, as well as students with the necessary support
- To give professional assessment to teachers upon request
- To cooperate with the English Language Center on mutual matters

III. PROCEDURE

- A) The courses delivered in English will be evaluated by:
 - Professor observation;
 - Professor surveys;
 - Student surveys
- B) The procedure uses the following steps:
- 1. Obtain schedule of courses delivered in English in advance
- 2. Establish contact with mentioned professors during the orientation sessions at the beginning of each period or during the first week of classes to inform them about these procedures
- 3. Schedule visits to all groups between the 4th and 5th weeks of classes
 - First observation of professors during class time
 - Deliver professor's survey at the same time
 - Pick up and process professors' surveys
 - Deliver students' survey
 - Pick up and process students' surveys
- 4. Summarize results for final presentation for the University Council Meeting

After mid-term exams repeat procedure as follows:

- 5. Second observation of professors during class time
- 6. Deliver and pick up professor's survey
- 7. Deliver and pick up students' survey
- 8. Process instruments and make final assessment
- 9. Verify whether or not exams are given in English
- 10. Compare results for final presentation for the University Council Meeting
- 11. Deliver copy of the results to the Academic Coordinators



IV. INSTRUMENTS

Three instruments are used in order to fulfill the evaluation purposes:

- 1. **Professors' Observation Guide –** (see Attachment 1). This instrument includes six general statements regarding skills levels.
- 2. **Professors' Interview -** (see Attachment 2). This instrument includes
 - Eight questions to assess the practice handbook
 - A guideline for Academi8c Writing
 - Student participation for remedial workshops
 - Proposal of ideas
- 3. **Students' Survey** (see Attachment 3). This instrument includes six questions oriented to self- evaluate the four skills.

The results are compared with data obtained in questions 18 and 19 of the Professors' Evaluation administered by the Mathematics Center:
